Dear Fire Administrative Board,

We, the Fire Officers of the Saugatuck Township Fire District, wish to file a formal complaint against Fire Board Member Roy McIlwaine. In our opinion, Mr. McIlwaine has violated the Restated Rules and Bylaws of the Saugatuck Township Fire District Fire Administrative Board.

The Restated Rules and Bylaws of the Saugatuck Township Fire District, A. Fire Administrative Board, Section 5. state "Candidates for the Board should be without bias and individuals who will not favor one governmental unit over another. Board members should be primarily interested in providing the best possible fire protection to the district, while always seeking the most efficient use of tax monies."

Mr. McIlwaine made the motion, and subsequent vote of support, to Sec. 16-27 Modifications to the ordinance to adopt the 2015 International Fire Code at the Township of Saugatuck's November 1st, 2017 board meeting. We feel that this action has placed the lives of the Fire District personnel, as well as ALL the Districts citizens at unnecessary risk. Again, in our opinion, Mr. McIlwaine has violated the bylaws by selectively looking out for members of the Township Board of Trustees, rather than all the citizens Mr. McIlwaine is intended to be serving in his position as a Fire Board member.

Our sworn duty as Fire Officers and command staff of the Fire District is to serve and protect ALL citizens, visitors, and personnel within the limits of the Saugatuck Township Fire District. We do this in accordance with our Mission "To minimize community risks and improve the quality of life for all persons within the Saugatuck Township Fire District." Mr. McIlwaine's actions will negatively impact our ability to effectively perform our sworn duties. We want to be on record that we disagree with the actions of Mr. McIlwaine, and the Board of Trustees of Saugatuck Township.

Re: Rules of Professional Responsibility

Dear Chief Janik:

I understand that at a recent Board meeting of the Saugatuck Township Fire District ("District"), questions were raised as to whether this office (Bloom Sluggett, PC) has a "conflict of interest" in representing the District because we also serve as general counsel to the City of Saugatuck ("City"). You asked that I provide an overview of an attorney's ethical obligations relative to the topic of conflicts of interest.

All lawyers licensed in the State of Michigan are bound to comply with the Michigan Rules of Professional Conduct ("MRPC"). The MRPC has been adopted by the Michigan Supreme Court and is, largely, based on rules and comments drawn from the American Bar Association's Model Rules of Professional Conduct.

The MRPC directly addresses the issue of conflicts of interest in Rule 1.7. In total it provides:

Rule: 1.7 Conflict of Interest: General Rule

- (a) A lawyer shall not represent a client if the representation of that client will be directly adverse to another client, unless:
- (1) the lawyer reasonably believes the representation will not adversely affect the relationship with the other client; and
 - (2) each client consents after consultation.
- (b) A lawyer shall not represent a client if the representation of that client may be materially limited by the lawyer's responsibilities to another client or to a third person, or by the lawyer's own interests, unless:
- (1) the lawyer reasonably believes the representation will not be adversely affected; and

(2) the client consents after consultation. When representation of multiple clients in a single matter is undertaken, the consultation shall include explanation of the implications of the common representation and the advantages and risks involved.

(Emphasis added.)

As noted in the comments to this rule (not formally part of the rule but considered appropriate guidance), the concept of a conflict of interest turns in large part on the need for loyalty. The question, properly framed, is whether an attorney in a particular situation has conflicted loyalties due to particular representation. If so, a conflict of interest exists. (Obviously, this is a variation on the prohibition against serving "two masters".)

In the case of the District and City, neither the representation of one or the other is inherently and directly adverse as addressed in MRPC Rule 1.7(a). Even were those parties to have directly adverse interests, the duty of the attorney is to determine if the representation will affect the representation of either and advise each client. In such cases, both clients must determine if they will consent to the dual representation after consultation (See MRPC, Rule 1.7(a)(1-2).)

More problematic is MRPC Rule 1.7(b), regarding the possibility that such dual representation may materially limit the attorney's representation of either client (e.g., is the attorney inclined to temper his or her counsel to either client because of the relationship with the other?). Regarding subsection (b), the comments to the rule are, again, helpful. They provide in part:

Loyalty to a client is also impaired when a lawyer cannot consider, recommend, or carry out an appropriate course of action for the client because of the lawyer's other responsibilities or interests. The conflict in effect forecloses alternatives that would otherwise be available to the client. Paragraph (b) addresses such situations. A possible conflict does not itself preclude the representation. The critical questions are the likelihood that a conflict will eventuate and, if it does, whether it will materially interfere with the lawyer's independent professional judgment in considering alternatives or foreclose courses of action that reasonably should be pursued on behalf of the client. ... Conflicts of interest in contexts other than litigation sometimes may be difficult to assess. Relevant factors in determining whether there is potential for adverse effect include the duration and intimacy of the lawyer's relationship with the client or clients involved, the functions being performed by the lawyer, the likelihood that actual conflict will arise, and the likely prejudice to the client from the conflict if it does arise. The question is often one of proximity and degree. For example, a lawyer may not represent multiple parties in a negotiation whose interests are fundamentally antagonistic to each other, but common representation is

permissible where the clients are generally aligned in interest even though there is some difference of interest among them.

(Emphasis added.)

I do not believe that a conflict exists simply because this firm represents both the City and the District. If the potential of a conflict of interest came into play (e.g., if the District and City were to enter into negotiations for the purchase of District property, etc.), then we would have an affirmative obligation to follow the guidance of Rule 1.7(b)(1-2). This would entail making a determination as to whether our representation would be adversely affected on behalf of either client and, if it were determined that this was not the case, consulting with both clients and allowing the clients to make an informed judgment.

Beyond the MRPC's provisions, this firm has consistently taken the position that whenever a potential conflict arises we advise the clients of the same and explain their options. Typically this involves allowing each of the clients to waive the potential conflict; if either determines not to waive, then we withdraw from representing both clients and recommend other legal counsel. Should an issue arise between the District and the City we would, consistent with our ethical obligations, take all steps required by the MRPC.

Please let me know if there are any remaining questions. Thank you.

International Fire Code

SECTION 108 BOARD OF APPEALS

[A] 108.1 Board of appeals established.

In order to hear and decide appeals of orders, decisions or determinations made by the fire code official relative to the application and interpretation of this code, there shall be and is hereby created a board of appeals comprised of three (3) regular members. Each municipality or jurisdiction which is a constituent member of the Saugatuck Township Fire District shall appoint one (1) regular member to the board consistent with this code including Appendix A. Each municipality or jurisdiction shall also appoint one (1) alternate member who will be called to serve in the absence or disqualification of the municipality or jurisdiction's regular member. Members shall be appointed for a term of four (4) years and may be reappointed for successive terms. Elected officials may not be appointed to serve as members of the board in any capacity. The fire code official shall be an ex officio member of said board but shall have no vote on any matter before the board. The board shall adopt rules of procedure for conducting its business, and shall render all decisions and findings in writing to the appellant with a duplicate copy to the fire code official.

[A] 108.2 Limitations on authority.

An application for appeal shall be based on a claim that the intent of this code or the rules legally adopted hereunder have been incorrectly interpreted, the provisions of this code do not fully apply, or an equivalent method of protection or safety is proposed. The board shall have no authority to waive requirements of this code.

[A] 108.3 Qualifications.

The board of appeals shall consist of members who are qualified by experience and training to pass on matters pertaining to hazards of fire, explosions, hazardous conditions or fire protection systems.

APPENDIX A

BOARD OF APPEALS

The provisions contained in this appendix are not mandatory unless specifically referenced in the adopting ordinance.

SECTION A101 GENERAL

A101.1 Scope.

A board of appeals shall be established within the jurisdiction for the purpose of hearing applications for modification of the requirements of the International Fire Code pursuant to the provisions of Section 108 of the International Fire Code. The board shall be established and operated in accordance with this section, and shall be authorized to hear evidence from appellants and the fire code official pertaining to the application and intent of this code for the purpose of issuing orders pursuant to these provisions.

A101.2 Membership.

The membership of the board shall consist of three (3) regular voting members having the qualifications established by this section. The fire code official shall nominate one (1) member from each municipality which is a constituent member of the Saugatuck Township Fire District who shall be subject to confirmation by the municipality. Each municipality shall also appoint one (1) alternate member who will be called to serve in the absence or disqualification of the municipality's regular member. Members shall serve without remuneration or compensation, and may be removed from office prior to the end of their appointed terms for cause.

A101.2.1 Deleted.

A101.2.2 Fire protection professional.

One (1) member shall be a qualified engineer, technologist, technician or safety professional trained in fire protection engineering, fire science or fire technology. Qualified representatives in this category shall include fire protection contractors and certified technicians engaged in fire protection system design.

A101.2.3 Deleted

A101.2.4 General contractor.

One (1) member shall be a contractor regularly engaged in the construction, alteration, maintenance, repair or remodeling of buildings or building services and systems regulated by the code.

A101.2.5 General industry or business representative.

One (1) member shall be a representative of business or industry not represented by a member from one of the other categories of board members described above.

A101.3 Terms of office.

Members shall be appointed for terms of four (4) years.

A101.3.1 Deleted

A101.3.2 Vacancies.

Vacancies shall be filled for an unexpired term in the manner in which original appointments are required to be made. Members appointed to fill a vacancy in an unexpired term shall be eligible for reappointment.

A101.3.3 Removal from office.

Members shall be removed from office prior to the end of their terms only for cause. Continued absence of any member from regular meetings of the board shall, at the discretion of the applicable municipality, render any such member liable to immediate removal from office.

A101.4 Quorum.

Three (3) members of the board shall constitute a quorum. In varying the application of any provisions of this code or in modifying an order of the fire code official, affirmative votes of the majority present, but not less than two (2), shall be required.

A101.5 Secretary of board.

The fire code official shall act as secretary of the board and shall keep a detailed record of all its proceedings, which shall set forth the reasons for its decisions, the vote of each member, the absence of a member and any failure of a member to vote.

A101.6 Deleted

A101.7 Meetings.

The board shall meet at regular intervals, to be determined by the chairman. In any event, the board shall meet within 10 days after notice of appeal has been received.

A101.8 Conflict of interest.

Members with a material or financial interest in a matter before the board shall declare such interest and refrain from participating in discussions, deliberations and voting on such matters.

A101.9 Decisions.

Every decision shall be promptly filed in writing in the office of the fire code official and shall be open to public inspection. A certified copy shall be sent by mail or otherwise to the appellant, and a copy shall be kept publicly posted in the office of the fire code official for two weeks after filing.

A101.10 Procedures.

The board shall be operated in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act of the state in which it is established or shall establish rules and regulations for its own procedure not inconsistent with the provisions of this code and applicable state law.
