Fire Code Board of Appeals – Rules of Procedure

Legal Review – Fire District Attorney

I understand a request has been made that the STFD Board consider adopting Rules of Procedure for the Fire Board of Appeals (BOA). As you know, the existence of the BOA derives from the communities' adoption of the 2015 International Fire Code (IFC). In relevant part, section 108.1 of the IFC as adopted by the communities provides that: ". . .[T]here is hereby created a board of appeals comprised of three (3) members of the Fire Administrative Board. . . . The board of appeals **shall adopt rules of procedure for conducting its business**, and shall render all decisions and findings" The highlighted language is identical to that contained in the IFC (i.e., without the communities' amendments). Thus, based on the plain language in the IFC it is our opinion that neither the Fire Board, Fire Chief, nor any individual community is authorized to adopt rules of procedure for the BOA.

Northshores Residential Water Supply

Legal Review – Fire District Attorney

Several months ago we contacted Saugatuck Township in an effort to clarify the scope of the STFD's review authority for one and two family residences given the Township's amendments to the IFC. As you are aware, we received from the Township a memorandum (dated April 4) which addressed the issues we raised. Of specific concern is the response the Township provided to one item (i.e., the STFD's review authority over water supply/fire flow in such developments). The Township's April 4 memorandum took the position that the STFD had, in fact, approved the water supply/fire flow for the North Shores' project, something which the STFD disputed. The STFD however is without authority to enforce the lack of water supply approval. Given the potential for liability we recommend that the STFD Board consider sending a letter to the Township clarifying the position of the STFD as a matter of public record. This will make clear, in the event of future claims, that the duty to enforce rests with the Township and that it the position of the STFD that no approval has, in fact, been granted to date. The proposed response to the Township Board asks only that the letter be made a matter of public record for transparency purposes and to put the public on notice. A draft of the letter prepared is attached. We do not believe it can be sent out without the STFD Board's approval because this is an area solely within the discretion of the STFD Board. Accordingly, we ask that it be placed on your agenda for discussion.

Dear Board Members:

As you are aware, this firm serves as general counsel to the Saugatuck Township Fire District ("STFD"). We are writing at the request of our client regarding the captioned matter and in order to make the STFD's position a matter of public record. This letter is, in some respects, a follow up to our earlier communication to the Township of March 20, 2018, and, specifically, focuses on the issue of whether approval of the water supply and fire flow requirements for North Shores has been granted by the STFD as mandated by the International Fire Code, 2015 edition ("IFC"), which the Township has acknowledged to be applicable.

It is not our intent to repeat the claims of each side and to detail, in a point-by-point fashion, the ways in which the Township's position is deficient. To summarize, the Township takes the position that the required approvals were granted by the Deputy Chief orally at a meeting of the Township Planning Commission in April, 2017. The STFD's position is that no such approval has (or could have been) granted under such circumstances.¹ We acknowledge that the Township and STFD have starkly differing perspectives as to whether an approval was granted and we do not wish to prolong these debates.²

Instead, and at the request of our client, we have been instructed to formally notify the Township as a matter of record, with copies to the developer, that it is officially the position of the STFD that <u>no</u> approval of "fire apparatus access and water supplies"³ has been granted by the Fire Code Official as required by law. It is further the position of the STFD that enforcement of this failure to obtain the required approvals rests with the Township and that the Township and developer both owe a duty and obligation to the property owners and insurers of parcels in North Shores to advise them of this material condition applicable to the development.

To the extent this letter is shared with members of the public and property owners in North Shores we wish to simply summarize the grounds for the STFD's position that it did not, in fact, approve North Shores' proposed water supply/fire flow:

- The comment on which the Township relies to argue that water supply and fire flow requirements for North Shores were approved by the STFD was made by the Deputy Chief, per the Township Planning Commission minutes, to the effect that the "<u>marina</u> [was not anticipated to add] an additional load to the department's service." (Emphasis added.) A fair reading of this hardly supports a finding that the STFD formally approved the water supply/fire flows for the entirety of the North Shores' development. Instead, the comments read in context make plain that they were directed to a special approval under consideration by the Planning Commission for the marina at that point in the meeting, not the PUD generally or any general PUD site plan review.
- These were verbal comments at a meeting, not a formal written approval as other STFD approvals are documented (in order that they can be relied upon by governmental authorities later)(see April 26, 2017 minutes of the Township Planning Commission).
- As late as April 18, 2017, as reflected in a letter from the STFD to the developer, there was no formal agreement or determination on the developer's proposed water supply/fire flow. Nothing documented changed in the intervening week before the Planning Commission meeting. Indeed, the Fire Code Official's comments of April 18 (e.g., that 1000 GPM would be needed at a minimum) were not agreed to by the developer.
- The Fire Code Official <u>never</u> received detailed construction documents or hydraulic calculations for review as required by the IFC; absent this, no plans were capable of being approved. The documents which have been submitted to the STFD were conceptual in nature.⁴
- The Township's position now seems in conflict with actions of Planning Commission at the same meeting. See, for example, Condition 9 of the PUD approval which required that "standpipes" (sic) were subject to later approval of the Zoning Administrator <u>after</u> <u>consultations with the Fire Chief</u> and Condition 17 which notes that "details regarding items required for condition 9" <u>had not yet been addressed</u>. Clearly to the extent that the use of "standpipes" was intended to reflect the fire flow issue for the PUD, the conditions themselves recognized that this issue had not yet been resolved or approved.

Thank you for your attention to this matter. We ask that this letter be included in the agenda packet for the next scheduled meeting of the Township Board and formally received into

⁴ Interestingly, three months after the STFD was advised by the Township that final approval had <u>already</u> been granted, the Fire Code Official received, on July 16, 2018, a drawing titled "Standpipe Section C-C" from Mr. Bosgraaf with a request to review. The review was performed on July 26 and a response sent asking that the plans be revised accordingly and resubmitted to the STFD. To date, no submittal has been received. Thus, there remains no approved water supply for fire protection at North Shores, despite on-going construction occurring there.
